# Objectives

---

---

- enhance IMT-GT's way of doing things
- identify areas for institutional strengthening and capacity building
- maintain relevance and responsiveness to change

# Existing IMT-GT Structure

---

---

- public sector-oriented
- multi-tiered and hierarchical
- weak public-private sector interface
- local governments inadequately mainstreamed
- driven by central ministries
- ownership within ministries is highly uneven

# Proposed Scope (1)

---

---

- Revisit the IMT-GT conceptual framework
- Determine what organizational arrangement works best for growth areas where state/local entities and the private sector are the key players;
- Identify areas of complementarity and/or duplication with other regional cooperation programs (e.g ASEAN)
- Division of labor among federal/central and state/local entities

# Proposed Scope (2)

---

---

- Define the division of labor among central ministries
- Review the role of the public and private sector entities, and the interface mechanisms between them
- Define the basic working unit for the program- Permanent sector working groups as they presently exist? Or project-oriented (ad hoc) task forces?
- Define the role of the CIMT in any new structure
- Review resource commitments

# Proposed Approach

---

---

- candid and realistic self-assessment
- driven primarily by the IMT-GT stakeholders
- participatory and consultative, guided by national secretariats in each country
- facilitated by eminent persons, assisted by national consultants
- conducted in parallel to Mid-Term Review of the Roadmap
